What is Trumbull's Education Channel?

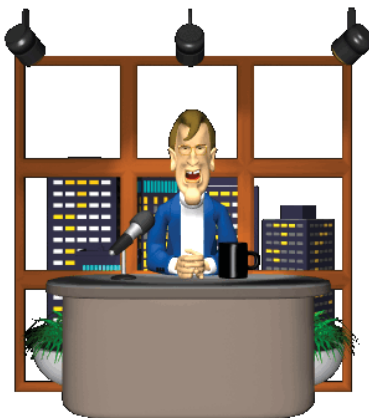
The Town of Trumbull's education access channel, is *the* TV station for the latest news and information about the Trumbull community. The channel offers a wide variety of programs including:

History of Trumbull's Education Channel

When cable television franchises were granted by the State of Connecticut, it set aside Educational Access Channels in each area. This gave schools and towns the opportunity to broadcast programs that would train students in videography and educate the public. Channel 17 was provided by Charter Communications. In 1996, the first television program was inaugurated under the direction of Superintendent of Schools Dr. Edwin T. Merritt. This first program was called "*Family University of Trumbull*" and it is still on the air today, twelve years later.

In 2001 Trumbull Public Schools began using Channel 17 to show some student-produced videotaped programs. Then in 2003, the Town of Trumbull Cable Advisory Committee was formed with its mission to "ensure that the residents of Trumbull have excellent local television" through "the creation, airing, and viewing of local programming that presents news and information specific to our community."



Broadcast Your Event on Trumbull's Education Channel

Requests to videotape a community, educational, or public service event should be made at least two weeks prior to the event or activity. An authorization form must be signed by the presenter to allow the taping of the event and certifying that permission to broadcast and copy has been obtained from content owners (i.e. music publishers).

Trumbull's Education Channel reserves the right to decline any request. Cancellation of a request should be made at least 24 hours prior to the event or activity.

The decision to air any videotape is within the sole discretion of Trumbull's Education Channel. Whether or not a program is aired and the date and time of broadcast are at the sole discretion of the Trumbull Education Channel management.
